One Day Class Scheduled for June

The Grand Lodge of Ohio has authorized another GRAND MASTER'S CLASS, a one-day program, which allows prospective Masons, and current Masons who have not completed their degrees to advance their fraternal experience of Masonry in a single day.

The deadline for a new candidate to submit a petition is February 19, 2009. This will allow time for review by the membership and investigations committees and submission of the petition for approval by the Lodge at two stated meetings. Those brethren who wish to complete their degree work should notify the Secretary by April 16, 2009, which will allow time to prepare the registration form and forward it to the Grand Secretary. Whether the petitioner is a candidate or a brother, attendance at all three Blue Lodge degrees is required to receive credit for any degree. Each candidate must be accompanied by a Master Mason as a mentor. Please plan on attending with your candidate.

Payment for the degrees (EA \$125, FC \$50 and MM \$50) is required to be made with the petition or registration request. Further information is available from Wor. Bro. Joel I. Newman, Secretary or from any officer of the Lodge.
